Regional Affiliations Committee Report: Chair, Suzanne Richard

This report primarily summarizes the ASOR activities at the various regional 2012 conferences. There are nine active ASOR regions; by active I mean those regions in which ASOR partners variously with SBL/AAR/AOS/CBA to sponsor annual scholarly conferences. They are: Central, Eastern Great Lakes (EGL), Midwest, Southeast, Southwest, Upper Midwest, Rocky Mountain, the Pacific Coast (PC), and the Pacific Northwest (PNW).

This year there were two ASOR sessions at the <u>Central Region</u> Conference (March 17-18). At the <u>EGL Region (April 4-5)</u>, there was for the first time in many years an ASOR president (Suzanne Richard) who was able to invite an ASOR plenary speaker, Jodi Magness, funded with the help of \$400 from ASOR. In the <u>Midwest Region</u> (Feb 8-10), there was a joint AOS/ASOR session on Cultures in Contact. The <u>Southeast Region</u> (part of SECSOR) held their conference March 15-17 and hosted one ASOR session. The <u>Southeast Region received funding in the amount of \$500 for their special session</u>. The <u>Southwest Regional (SWCRS)</u> (March 8-10) program included two ASOR sessions, a joint ASOR/SBL sessions, and an ASOR Excavation Report Session. The <u>Upper Midwest (April 5-6)</u> put out a call for ASOR papers, but there were no sessions. Likewise, the PC region (March 24-26) put out a call for ASOR papers, but there were no sessions. In the PNW (May 11-13), there was one ASOR session.
