 - Determine best practices and the means by which to implement them;
 - Develop standards, policies and protocols and trainings designed to educate and inform all participants on archaeological excavations about ethics and laws in the field and on research projects;
 - Under the auspices of ASOR, provide access to relevant documents for excavation leaders, staff, volunteers, and employees.
