Sheldon graduated from Duke University in 1981 with an undergraduate degree in Management Science/Accounting.

He joined Peat, Marwick & Mitchell (now KPMG) in Raleigh in early 1982 and was admitted as a tax partner in 1993. During his 16 + year career at KPMG he served publicly-traded financial services corporations, privately-owned businesses in several industries and high net worth individuals.
