Welcome to the in-person component of ASOR's 2022 Annual Meeting, November 16-19, in downtown Boston, Massachusetts.

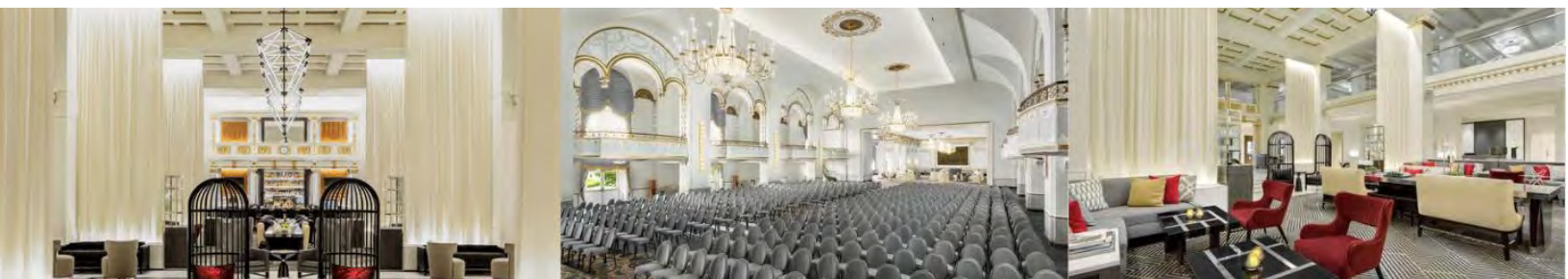
The conference will be held at the [Boston Park Plaza, 50 Park Plaza, Boston, MA 02116](#).

Only steps away from the Public Garden, Theater District, and many of the city's best shopping, restaurants, and historical sites, the Boston Park Plaza is an ideal location to enjoy ASOR sessions during the day and explore the city during the evening.

**Parking:** Valet parking is available at the Boston Park Plaza for \$30 (up to 8 hours) or \$65 (8+ hours/overnight). The valet entrance is at 34 Columbus Ave. Self-parking is available at the [Motor Mart Garage](#), which is across the street from the hotel (26 Park Plaza, and an entrance off Stuart Street) with rates starting at \$14 and overnight parking at \$40.

**Dining:** Enjoy breakfast, lunch, and dinner in the hotel lobby at the Boston Park Plaza's signature restaurant [Off The Common](#). During the ASOR Annual Meeting, Off The Common will offer an express menu with to-go breakfast and lunch options, such as bagels, oatmeal, and breakfast sandwiches, and a sandwich/chips or salad/beverage combination for lunch.

The Boston Park Plaza also houses a full-service Starbucks location in the hotel lobby, as well as [Strega Italiano](#) – a modern restaurant with exceptional Italian cuisine, seafood, and steak. There are also a variety of dining options in all price ranges within a short walk from the hotel, including [MJ O'Connor's](#) pub, [Maggiano's Little Italy](#), and a number of quick-bite options at [City Place](#) in the State Transportation Building (10 Park Plaza).

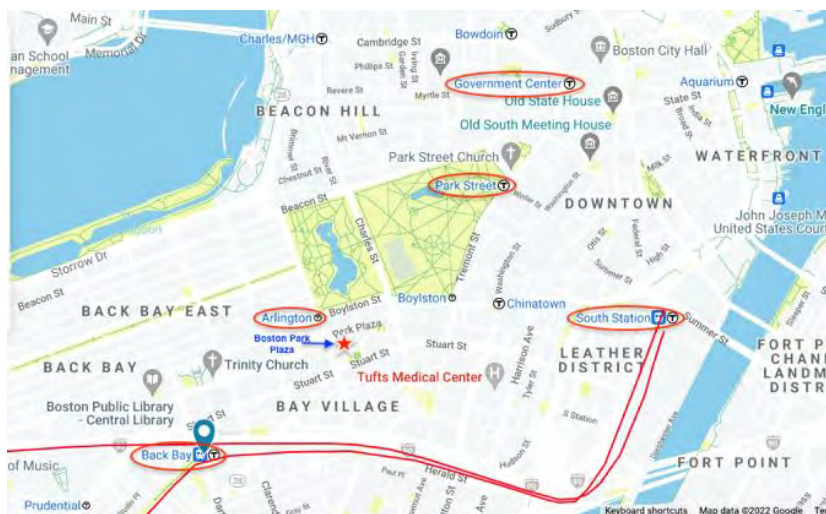

### **Getting Around:**

Public Transportation is the easiest and cheapest option for getting around Bean Town. The **MBTA** or simply the “T” is Boston’s public transportation system with subway, bus, trolley, and boat services. MBTA has a tool called [Trip Planner](#) that lets you plan your T ride from beginning to end.

The closest T stops to the Boston Park Plaza are the Arlington Street (Green Line) and Back Bay (Orange Line) Stations. From the airport you can take the blue line to Government Center and switch to the Green Line to Arlington T Station, which is approximately 500 feet from the hotel entrance. You can also take the free Silver Line bus to South Station (approximately .8 miles from the hotel).



### **Boston Highlights:**

While in Boston, enjoy free admission to a number of area museums. The [Harvard Museum of the Ancient Middle East \(HMANE\)](#) has free admission and is hosting a private reception for ASOR attendees on Saturday, November 19. Advance sign-up is required (see page 7).

[The Harvard Art Museums](#) will offer free admission to ASOR Annual Meeting attendees between November 15 – 23 (closed on Monday 11/21). Conference goers should stop at the Admissions desk (or the podium in the Courtyard) and show their ASOR Name Badge in order to get free admission.
